2009 MICHIGAN QSO PARTY

Attention Michigan Amateurs!!!!

This years QSO Party will be held on April 18^{th.}

In spite of the lousy conditions last year, it was a record year for the MiQP. Activity was up and we had over 300 entries with a record 41,660 total QSO's. There has been a lot of traffic on the MiQP email reflector announcing 2009 operations from all around the state. The early indications point to another record year. With the support of fixed, mobile and portable stations, we plan on having activity in all 83 counties. Whether you operate from the home station, the club station, the EOC, mobile, or portable, the important thing is that you get on the air and join the fun. Operate for an 1 hour, or the full 12 hours, every little bit of RF will help make Michigan "Radio Active".

In addition to the normally awarded plagues and certificates for the different categories, there will be a special 'Rookie of the Year Award" in 2009. It should also be noted that the ARRL has declared 2009 "The Year of the State QSO Party" and is offering a special certificate. Others will need to work Michigan stations during the QSO party to earn the Michigan flag for their ARRL award <u>http://www.arrl.org/awards/ysqso/</u>

Date /Time: Michigan QSO Party, sponsored by the Mad River Radio Club, from 1600Z April 18th until 0400Z (19th) Stations may operate the full 12 hours. (12 noon on the 18th until 12 midnight local Michigan time)

Modes and Categories: Phone and CW on 80/40/20/15/10 meters. Single-op, multi-op, mobile and Emergencies Operations Center (EOC) and "Rookie" categories. Single-op entries are categorized by output power, QRP (5W or less), Low Power (100W or less), and High Power (greater than 100W).

Multipliers: Work stations once per band and mode. Work other states and Michigan Stations. MI to MI QSO's are allowed. Work portables and mobiles again as they change counties, state or province.

Exchange: Exchange QSO number and location (county for MI stations, state/province or "DX" for others). Scoring: One point per phone QSO, two points per CW QSO. Count multipliers once per mode. Multipliers are MI Continued next column →

Digital Test Planned for April 11.

The Section will hold a test of HF digital modes on April 11. Each DEC will be asked to provide one station to transmit, preferably an EOC. Other stations are asked to copy. There will be a schedule of times and modes published. All tests will be held on 80 meters. Receiving stations are asked to save their copy and email it to W8RIT. This test will give us some insight into the effectiveness of some of the HF digital modes over various paths. While a test conducted over a single morning will not be able to give us much insight into the effect of varying conditions, we do hope to gain some feeling for how effectively we might use these modes within the section. Modes to be tested are BPSK-31, Olivia 16/500, MFSK 16, and MT63 500 long. Stations are asked to begin familiarizing themselves with their software and check out their interfaces if they do not use them routinely. More details will be sent to all DECs and ECs and published on the ARPSC web site. Thanks, John WB8RCR

Dx Packet Cluster

At present the **WA8DX** Spider Packet Cluster node **WA8DX** is receiving DX info via K1XX in FL or N8NM in Waterford.

This is a tool you can use to build your DXCC total, see where people are working stations on both HF and VHF, and even pass messages.

You can also connect via the internet. Telnet to **wa8dx.servebeer.com** port **7300** Once connected you will get a welcome screen that asks for info. You should start to see DX spots right away.

Although you can stay connected indefinitely, if you decide to disconnect, type **b** or **bye** and you will be logged out.
