It's time for Michigan QSO Party

+++ Michigan QSO Party in April +++

The 2010 Michigan QSO Party (MiQP) will be April 17-18. All amateurs are invited to participate. As usual, Michigan amateurs receive contest points for contacting other amateurs within the state/section. Amateurs outside of Michigan earn contest points for QSOs with Michigan hams, only. As the announcement of the Party says, "This is a great opportunity develop HF operating skills, represent the great state of Michigan, and last but not least, have a bunch of fun. Even if you don't consider yourself a contest operator, you'll probably find it's a blast to jump in to work the throng who will

be looking for Michigan QSOs. If you've ever operated on Field Day, you'll certainly be ready for MiQP."

The operating period is twelve hours long, from noon local time (1600Z) until midnight local (0400Z) Eastern time. "Activity takes place on the 80 thru 10 meter bands, on both phone and CW. The exchange is simple:

a sequential QSO number (starting with 1, then 2, 3...) and your location (county for Michigan stations, and state, province or "DX" for others). A station may be worked once per band and mode, with CW QSOs counting two points and phone QSOs counting one point (just like Field Day). Multipliers are states, provinces, and Michigan counties, counted once on phone and once on CW. Final score is total

QSO points times total multipliers."

There are handsome plaques for major category winners in Michigan and certificates for the top single-operator score in each Michigan county. There is a competition for Michigan clubs where scores of its members are combined into an aggregate score for that club. There are also categories and awards for mobile and multi-operator stations.

"The separate category instituted in 2008 for Emergency Operation Center (EOC) stations has become a permanent part of MiQP, and continues in 2010. A handsome MiQP plaque will be awarded to the highest scoring EOC station and certificates for second and third place. We are also continuing the 'MiQP Rookie Of The Year' plaque instituted in 2007, which is awarded to the top single-operator score submitted by a Michigan station who has never participated in MiQP before." [The rookie plaque was won byJeff Miller, WB8WKQ, a Lapeer County ham in the 2009 MI QSO Party and the Multi-Single plaque was won by the Eastern MI ARC, K8EPV, operating at K8DD's QTH –ed.]

Myth vs Fact

MYTH: When a tornado is approaching, open windows!

FACT: Don't spend precious moments opening windows, BECAUSE IT DOES NOT REDUCE TORNADO DAMAGE. Just get to the lowest level of the building, away from windows. Anyone close to a window could be injured or killed by flying debris.

MYTH: Get out of a car and hide under a highway overpass.

FACT: Many people remember seeing footage of the television news crew that "survived" a tornado by seeking shelter under an overpass. In reality, that tornado only passed nearby, and did not directly impact them. Overpasses are not tornado shelters. People died in Wichita Falls in April of 1979, and 20 years later in Oklahoma City, after seeking shelter in highway overpasses. The UPWARD SLOPING GROUND BENEATH OVERPASSES ACTUALLY ACCELERATES TORNADIC WINDS, THUS SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASING YOUR CHANCE OF BEING IMPALED BY FLYING DEBRIS. MYTH: Cars are safer than mobile homes during a tornado.

FACT: Neither is safe. Get to the nearest tornado shelter. If you are in your car and there are no structures near, abandon the vehicle and get in the nearest ditch and cover your head.

MYTH: Tornadoes are the NUMBER ONE severe weather killer in the United States. FACT: Flash flooding is actually the number ONE severe weather-related killer in the country.

MYTH: Areas near rivers, lakes, and mountains are safe from tornadoes.

FACT: No place is safe from tornadoes. In the late 1980s, a tornado swept through Yellowstone National Park leaving a path of destruction up and down a 10,000 ft. mountain.

MYTH: Tornadoes tend to avoid large cities. FACT: Not true...Many large cities across the country were directly hit by tornadoes in recent years MYTH: Tornadoes, like lightning, never strike the same place twice.

FACT: Not true. Both tornadoes and lightning can strike in the same place twice.

MYTH: The threat of a lightning strike is OVER once the rain stops.

FACT: NOT TRUE. IF you can hear thunder, you can still be hit by lightning. Lightning can strike up to 10

miles away from a storm. THE GENERAL RULE IS TO WAIT THIRTY MINUTES AFTER THE LAST LIGHTNING OR THUNDER TO RESUME OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES.

Micon meeting notes, 3/20/2010

First off I want to thank Tom KD8EBY for asking me to fill in for him. Never been to a MICON (Michigan Inter County Organizational Network) meeting and did not know what to expect. I found it very interesting. Learned a few things and became curious on a few things as well.

Anyway these are some highlights from my scribbling at the meeting.

As far as the Snow this winter for the area,

"Snowiest" ranking, Saginaw 11th, Flint 2nd, Detroit 5th

As for severe weather events 2009 was the lowest recorded at 102 events. In comparison 1995 was 117 and 1997 was 115.

We had 3 tornados in all of Michigan , zero in S.E. Michigan for the first time since 1983.

CTA (Call to action) reports will include wind/hail tags. The tags will be after the CTA post with Polygon Storm Motion info wind speeds/hail size and current Lat/Long of the storm. Spotter Reports will now be listed in the 3rd paragraph (bullet) of the CTA. Spotter activation from DTX . There will be a prepage warning via text message. A test text will be sent about 1:00pm April 4th.

***** Spotter required info, GPS coordinates or address or closest intersection. *****

MICON/WEBINAR Storm briefings . For the November meeting they will have WEBINAR for overflow.

K8DTX Packet was getting upgraded as I left. It will now be a j-nos set-up. K8DTX is on 145.760 and is not a mailbox. It is not for real-time reports. Damage Reports and Storm Measurement only.

Transmissions will be sent to a printer for review. There will be a Field Day at the White Lake site. Feel free to stop by. 9200 White Lake Rd . White Lake, MI 48386

There was also talk of the APRS tracking system being employed by NOAA to track spotters and provide better location info. It uses Google Map Technology at <u>www.http://aprs.fi/</u>. You too can track the MICON/APRS spotters at that site.
