Ham With A Beat

One of this month's sites extends the Ham radio musical application beyond the CW examples, mentioned last month.

It turns out that there was actually a professionally recorded song called "CQ Serenade." The music was written by Maurice Durieux, VE2QS, who happened to be the conductor of the Radio Canada orchestra. Originally, the lyrics were in French, because VE2QS emigrated from Europe. Someone later translated the lyrics to English. The song was written at the end of the 1960s, but the music and performance sound like something out of the early 1940s, and could have been performed by the Andrews Sisters from that era.

Steve Ford, WB8IMY, mentioned this in the latest QST. The gist is that Oona Räisänen, OH2EIQ* (Finland), heard noise in the audio of a news video. She guessed that the tone was data, and analysis proved correct. When decoded, Oona learned that the tone contained GPS information from a helicopter that was following a car during a police chase. She then plotted the helicopter's course on a map.



Are you ready for Spring Flooding?



On average, flooding causes more property damage in the United States than any other weather related event. It is a threat to life and property that can occur in any of the fifty states or U.S. territories at any time of year. In 2013, the nation watched as deadly floods from severe storms impacted the Great Plains during May and record rainfall caused devastating flooding in Colorado in September. Last year, 85 people lost their lives to freshwater flooding. More than half of those fatalities were a result of people driving into floodwaters. On average, there are 89 fatalities and \$8.3 billion in damages annually. Being prepared for a flood can not only help keep your family safe, it can also help minimize potential flood damage and quicken recovery efforts. In 2006 Lopeer County received between 6 to 10 inches of rain in a 24-hour period resulting in major flooding that damaged over 300 homes and several businesses. The damages from this one storm alone caused damages that were estimated at over \$1,000,000.
