Lightning (Part Two)

Last month's topic was personal lightning detection. This month the topic is world-wide studies, and where Michigan fits.

NASA has conducted lightning studies for several decades. The first link is to an explanation of the effects of lightning on the human body. It also includes a map of states that have the highest lightning-induced casualties. Notice that Michigan is among the high group:






