



The Treasurer Says:

Greetings to one and all. Brrrr., what a cold winter. We should be outdoors putting up antennas or something this time of year. No were stuck indoors staying out of the cold.

I have been negotiating the lease on the tower out at Maple Grove School. As reported to you quite some time ago, the school was going to want us to add their name to our liability insurance policy. At that time it was going to cost us an additional \$50 a year to do that. I was unwilling, and told the new administration so. After much negotiating with both the school and the insurance co. we came to a compromise. The Trustee Says:

Hello W8LAP Supporters:

There have been no issues that involve the trustee administration function, and no system malfunctions.

This month's Links:

Club Call Trustees

The LCARA meeting minutes recently referenced asking the trustee for W8LAP (me) about using the call for the upcoming Michigan QSO party. The FCC rules mention nothing about the procedure for requesting or granting use of a club call at the club level. The rules do note both the requirements for obtaining a club call, and the responsibilities of the trustee.

To obtain a club call, the FCC requires that the club possess certain documents, have a minimum membership, and the trustee be approved/appointed by the club president. Application for trusteeship is done through the VEC office of the ARRL. Details are at http://www.arrl.org/club-call-signs.

The essence of trusteeship is to assure that a call is used within the parameters of FCC Part 97 (Amateur Radio Service) rules. The club call is a <u>station</u> license, but not an <u>operator</u> license. This means that a club call may only be used within privileges of either the radio operator, or the control operator. Put another way, if you are given permission to use W8LAP, it must be used with the operating privileges of your license. K6RIA has a very good explanation and Q&A at <u>k6ria.net/PDF/Club callsign use.pdf</u>

Some clubs have taken permissions to the extreme. These include requirements for written requests, time limits, and written explanations when the call is used in situations where FCC rule infractions occur. An example is on the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club site: http://www.bvarc.org/index.php?page=clubcall. I'll leave it to you to opine on the sagacity of having a full page of instructions, and a request form, let alone submitting to the club board of directors, instead of the trustee.

For W8LAP, using the call is simple: Send an email to me, with the circumstances of your proposed use, and I'll get back to you.

One matter of trusteeship that LCARA differed from some clubs, relative to the club repeater, is in repeater maintenance. For decades, this club considered that the W8LAP trustee possessed the knowledge and equipment to maintain the club repeater. This was, in fact, the case with all past trustees, to my awareness. The FCC rules do not require this, however. Thus, when asked to take over as trustee, I sought other members with more technical experience and equipment to oversee the practical aspects of the W8LAP repeater. Although I work with our Tech Team* at the site, my primary responsibility is to see that the W8LAP call is not used improperly in operation, and has an interference-free signal.

FCC license policy update

To all radio amateurs SB QST ARL ARLBOO7 ARLBOO7 FCC "Paperless" Amateur Radio License Policy Now in Effect Starting today, February 17, the FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees.

The Commission maintains that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS), although the FCC had routinely continued to print and mail hard copy licenses until this week. In mid-December, the FCC adopted final procedures to provide access to official electronic authorizations, as it had proposed in WT Docket 14-161 as part of its "process reform" initiatives.

Under the new procedures, licensees will access their current official authorization ("Active" status only) via the ULS License Manager. The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one.

Licensees will also be able to print out an official authorization - as well as an unofficial "reference copy" - from the ULS License Manager. "We find this electronic process will improve efficiency by simplifying access to official authorizations in ULS, shortening the time period between grant of an application and access to the official authorization, and reducing regulatory costs," the FCC Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (WTB) said.

According to the WTB, the new procedures will save at least \$304,000 a year, including staff expenses.

WHY TESTING AND PRACTICE IS IMPORTANT?

If 9/11/2001 was a wake up call to America, Hurricane Katrina was a very loud alarm clock! Within a few months, most Amateur Radio operators will hit the "snooze-button" and go back to their self-centered lives. Emergency communications is simply not a priority to them, while hamfests, DXing, contests, clubs, and coffee breaks (which are all fun) are given top billing.

One axiom of disaster planning is, the longer it has been since the last disaster, the closer you are to the next one. Just because you recently experienced one disaster, that does not make you immune from another one. Prior to any disaster, delusion and denial are common. They may be collective (everyone has it) and contagious (it is spread from person-toperson). It is common to see these potentially catastrophic behaviors displayed by local, state, and federal agency officials. These are known as the "It won't happen to me" and/or the "It won't happen here" syndrome.

Hurricane Katrina was arguably the worst natural disaster to ever hit the United States. It is also the most classic textbook illustration of The Delusion of Personal Invulnerability since the decade immediately prior to World War II. While the hurricane itself could not be avoided, the lack of preparedness could have been prevented. It would be less than honest to say "we never saw this coming". Over the past few decades, study after study has forecast that the City of New Orleans was "a sitting duck," just waiting to be destroyed. All the experts agreed that it wasn't a question of "if", it was only a question of "when". Sadly, that question has now been answered.

To say that a disaster of this magnitude is overwhelming is a gross under statement. There will (of course) be all the usual finger-pointing and denial after denial as to "who is to blame". Much of this will be unfair criticism. There is also enough justifiable blame to go around. Hopefully it will be directed appropriately and fairly.

The storm and flood victims are also victims of "The Great Society". For the past forty years the delusion that "The government will protect and come and save us," has dominated the thinking of many Americans, local and state government politicians, appointees and bureaucrats. I doubt that Hurricane Katrina will do much to change this mindset that is so embedded in many people.

In the 1950s and 1960s, the nation's focus for disaster preparedness was personal responsibility. Now it's: "When will the government get here to help me?" Many of us who have been around for awhile remember all the booklets, courses, even TV programs on self-reliance.

While some official agencies were spinning their wheels during the first few days following Hurricane Katrina, some non-government organizations and private individuals mobilized and got to work. One example is the ballet school operator who got so frustrated watching "the authorities" hold press conference after press conference that she went into action without any authorization". She recruited local doctors and nurses, rented a large van, stocked up on medical supplies, and headed into the stricken area. Then proceeded to provide the only medical care to a community in Mississippi. Or, how about the woman physician from Kansas, who loaded up her station wagon and set up shop in one of the worst hit areas in Louisiana?

Emergency communications is often a low priority in the thinking of most emergency planners, yet it is the central nervous system that conveys intelligence information and resource requests during any disaster. In my opinion, it should rank as high as emergency medical care. What good is emergency medical care if those in need cannot communicate their needs?

If our "plan" is to wait until ARES/RACES is "activated" by some government official, we may have a long wait. The important thing, whether your ARES/RACES group is deployed or not, is to be prepared for such a deployment.

Let me be very clear. I am talking about everyone knowing how to originate, relay and deliver a radiogram. Don't wait around for the nightly traffic net, and let someone else do it for you. Even though NTS nets should be operating, everyone must know how to get their message into the system. I am talking about basic planning documents and guidelines. I am talking about self-contained, highly portable equipment. Most importantly, I am talking about having people who are equipped with knowledge and experience.

We have all heard some ham say: "I am not interested in any preparedness activity or meetings or training, but in an emergency I'll be there to help!" Visualize for a moment what would happen if the musicians within a community took this same attitude. "I am not interested in attending any practice sessions or rehearsals. But the next time the symphony has a concert I'll be there with my horn! Since I own an instrument and play with it once a week doesn't that make me qualified? And, why do you insist that we all play from the same page of music?"

If any Amateur Radio operators should be leading the fight against this sort of apathy and ignorance, it should be ARES/RACES leaders and members. Apathy and ignorance are killers.
