

Link of the Month - Morse Code in Research

Last month's link, an experimental method of learning Morse, developed at Georgia Institute of Technology, was introduced. If you missed it, go here: http://phys.org/news/2016-10-morse-code.html

This month's link illustrates how researchers at Berufsgenossenschaftliches Universitätsklinikum Bergmannsheil, in Germany, are using Morse to investigate how the brain behaves during learning. They claim that characteristics of Morse (long and short elements, plus pauses) give the researchers an ideal method of observing which areas of the brain are used during the learning process.

When the requirement for knowing Morse Code was removed from Amateur Radio licensing, many predicted that Morse would fade into history. The above links illustrate that these predictions may be premature, indeed.
