Notes From the Desk of the Secretary

Lapeer County Amateur Radio Association- Meeting Minutes - January 9. 2018

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by President Gerret, KD8YUK. There were 17 members and guests in attendance.

General Announcements:

-The untimely death of K3LP was reported.

- -Skywarn training in Lapeer County will be April 5th at 7 pm the PIX Theater.
- -Several proposals for club logos were viewed. The logo with the lightning bolt seemed to be preferred. More to follow.

Secretary's Report

-The November meeting minutes were approved, as published in the Waveguide, by the membership present.

Treasurer's Report

- -The Treasurer's report was approved as presented by the membership present.
- -Bill, KD8VP will retire as Treasurer. If no one steps up to assume this office, our association cannot exist.

Repeater Trustee Report

- -Additional repeater control operators are needed. Contact Mike, KN8Z for details.
- -The GE Master II was inoperative before Christmas. The Yaesu back up was pressed into service. The problem with the Master II was an auxiliary fuse connection that open circuited. Replaced the fuse holder and all is well. Will, KB8YGA investigated the previously reported spur on 147.04 and determined that it exists. However it is 50 dB below the output level and hence the transmitter is within specification and regulation. No further action at this time is required.
- -Since our Operation Care fundraiser is no longer supported, Mike, KN8Z requests those items occupying the space in the repeater shack be moved elsewhere to allow easier repeater accessibility by the repeater team. The items will be redistributed.

Digital Repeater Committee Report

-Their recommendation for a digital repeater system will be presented at the April 2018 meeting.

Old Business

The Board of Directors was tasked to report at the January 2018 meeting, a possible membership dues increase since the Operation Care fundraiser was abandon. Several

proposals were discussed and the motion was made by Ed W8NCJ to raise the dues, effective 2018-2019 club year, to \$20 for single member and \$30 for the family rate. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved by the membership present.


Hello W8LAP Supporters:

In late November, the two meter repeater quit working. Inspection by the Tech Team revealed that the root of the failure was in the transceiver. All other equipment in the shack was functioning as it should.

A few days after the failure, Will, KB8YGA swapped the broken GE transceiver for a backup Yaesu unit. There were few technical issues, such as mating it fully with the CAT 1000 controller, but the swap went smoothly. The only issue is that the Yaesu unit has less than 10 Watts output power, while the GE unit had 40 Watts. Thus, our coverage was reduced a bit.

Will inspected the GE unit and found a melted fuse holder in the transmitter final amplifier. This holder is not part of the original GE circuitry. The http://www.repeater-builder.com site shows many modifications that Hams made to commercial units, such as our GE, to add robustness. This added fuse and holder is one of those mods.

Here is the toasted component:





After Will replaced the holder, the GE was re-installed, and tests for function showed 100%.

Fortunately, the removal and swap of the units happened when we had relatively warm (for winter) weather. A few weeks later, when the temperatures dove to 10 degrees F, or less, for eleven days, performing the swap would have been uncomfortable, to say the least.
